After the presentation, Sew n' Tell was presented and enjoyed and then the meeting adjourned.



Program—Fibers to Fabrics



Marva is a member of the Handweavers Guild of America. She currently has several pieces at the Mississippi Craft Center (soon to be the Bill Waller Craft Center).

Marva was born in MS and has lived here every since. She has a Masters degree from Ole Miss and has taught for years. Not only in schools as an academic teacher but teaching her craft as well. She has been honored as the 2nd life time member of the Chimneyville Hand Weavers.


The first fiber she used to weave was "flax" that she made linen from. Marva handed various fibers for us to touch and feel as well as pull a sample from to keep. One unusual one was "brown" cotton, there is also red and green cotton. There is a law in the south that colored cotton cannot be grown due to cross pollination. (farmers do not want color in the white cotton they grow to sell) Color cotton can be grown in Arizona and California. They are highly priced, as there is no need to add dye for color.



Marva distributed several varieties of wool. The softness a "merino" wool. Other fibers distributed to feel and touch included mole hair, sheep hair, silk,

silk caps (silk cocoons that were opened and stretched; alpaca, camel and lama hair. Angora rabbits plugs were passed around; these are plunked from the rabbits every few months.

Marva then explained the removing of seeds from cotton bolls and demonstrated how to card the cotton and displayed skeins of home spooled cotton.
