Minutes of Monthly Meeting

May 7, 2018

Debbie informed us of a California professor that is seeking quilters to participate in a "Quilting and Copyright" questionnaire. Questionnaires are available to pick up and review. Debbie introduced our program speaker, Lucy Large to give advice on piping and mitered borders.

Piping and mitered borders

Helpful hints included -

- Before adding piping stitch 1/4 all around the quilt
- Mark all 4 corners of the quilt, 1/4 on both sides of corners
- When pinning piping, pin in far enough that pins will not be in your in the way of machine's foot when sewing and pin in the direction you are sewing for easy removal

Double Piping using polyester cording


- 3/16" cording is Lucy's favorite
- 2" or 1 1/2"fabric strips cut on the bias
- Run glue stick down the center of the fabric strip to hold the cording in place
- Use you sewing machine's open toe foot
- Use red thread
- Sew to the body of the quilt on the top of the quilt

Lucy recommended cutting binding for quilts at 2 1/4" wide and 1 3/4" wide for smaller projects.
