There being no other business or announcements, Sew-n-Tell was shared and the meeting was adjourned.





- Fair workers try to display as many quilts as they can
- No prize money for entries
- Quilts are accepted for display the Friday prior to the State Fair, 9 am 5 pm
- Fair workers hope to have a longarm set up for visitors to experience long-arming, quilting on an actual quilt.
- Other crafts that are accepted for display include (but are not limited to) the following -
  - Crochet / knitting items
  - Tatting
  - Hand needlework smocking, embroidery, needlepoint
  - Leather works, wood work, metal work and paintings
  - Beadwork (no jewelry)
  - Earthen ware
  - Pickup of items that were on display is the Monday after the State Fair ends till 1:00 pm
  - YOUTH categories are the same as the adult




