


Blossom Chain

2025 Brandon Quilters Mystery Quilt




Background	Color A	Color B	Color C

Now it's time to put it all together. If you are making the small quilt, there should be 5 Chain blocks and 4 Blossom blocks. If you are making the larger quilt there should be 15 of each. The layout of the top is simply alternating blocks. If the pressing directions were followed, the blocks should nest together.



The center of the small quilt should measure 36 1/2" x 36 1/2" and the larger quilt should measure 60 1/2" x 72 1/2" before adding borders. If you want the center of the quilt to be larger before borders, consider adding sashing and cornerstones.





These quilts are finished with 2" sashing and cornerstones. The sashing needs to be cut $2\frac{1}{2}" \times 12\frac{1}{2}"$ and the corner stones $2\frac{1}{2}" \times 2\frac{1}{2}"$.

The small quilt needs 24 pieces of sashing and 16 cornerstones. The large quilt needs 71 pieces of sashing and 42 cornerstones.

These quilts have a 1" finished (cut $1\frac{1}{2}"$) and a 3" (small quilt) or 4" (large quilt) finished outer border. Cut the fabric $\frac{1}{2}"$ wider than the finished size.

When cutting borders it is important to measure YOUR quilt, so I am not going to tell you how long to cut the borders. Typically I measure the center of my quilt vertically to determine how long my side borders should be. I sew them to the quilt, then measure the width of the quilt to determine how long to cut my top and bottom border. I do this the inner and the outer border.

As this is YOUR quilt, feel free to add your own spin to the border. I can't wait to see them over the next few months.
