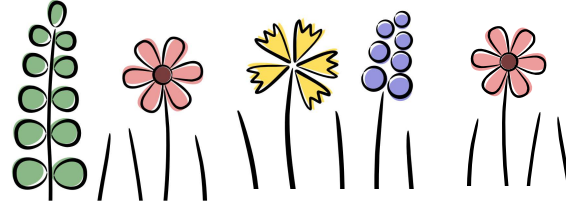

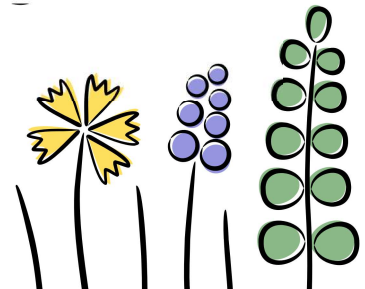
I have sometimes found, going into a workshop without all the answers to my questions, is the fun exploration portion of the lesson. Anticipate learning something new.

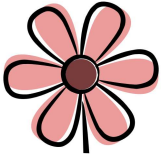

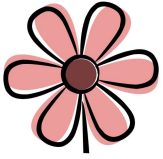
Business updates -

- Minutes - Susie asked for a motion to accept the March minutes as noted in the March newsletter. Pam Avara made the motion and Beth Sonnier second the motion and all agreed.
- Treasurer's report - Ann Callender, we currently have available funds of \$7,247.80. March had \$924 in deposits, \$477.76 in expenses, less UFO and retreat monies collected in reserve.
- Sunshine - Pam Beard, six April birthday cards are ready to be mailed out for April.
- Sit-n-Sew - Sarah Ketchum, held the weekend before our meeting and was well attended. Patriotic quilts are needed for display at the library during June, July and August. Please sign up at the May meeting and bring to the June meeting.
- Community Quilts - Polly Duggan, Ann Williams delivered 16 quilts to Star Fire Department. Fire Chief, Jackie Squires sent a huge thank you. Polly has 16 quilts ready to deliver to the Children's Safe Center plus the 80 pillow cases that were brought in tonight as the President's Challenge.
- Other - Pamela Kirby as delivered 108 dog beds so far this year. She also donated 2 sewing machines to the Brandon Middle school. The art teacher was very appreciative. The teacher would gladly accept donations of odd fabrics of any type for their art projects.

Regional quilting updates -

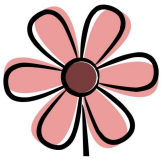
Our program for the evening was celebrating our 25th anniversary with cake and fellowship. Thank you to Karen Petrignani for purchasing the cake, plates, water, etc.

Tips & Tricks -

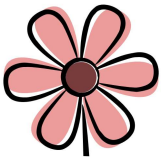

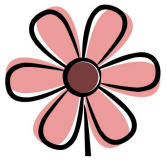

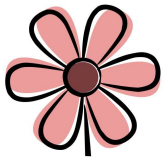

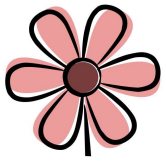
